Live Like a Local. Centre's signature long-term residential programs in England (London), France (in Strasbourg, across the Rhine River from Germany), and Mexico, (in Merida, on the Yucatan Peninsula) are directed by Centre professors. Additional long-term programs in China, England, Japan, Northern Ireland, Scotland, and Spain offer the chance to live with local students in residence halls or other accommodations. The long-term programs give you the chance to really get to know a new part of the world. Get ready for the adventure of your life.


**The Financials.** All your scholarship and financial aid arrangements remain in place, so the tuition cost of semester-long international study is about the same on campus or across the world. Short-term and summer programs are additional, but some aid is available.

Where in the World? CentreTerm, during January, is the time to explore new places from perspectives you never dreamed possible. Topics planned for CentreTerm 2016 include social identity in Argentina, tourism and sustainability in Ecuador, politics in Egypt, religion in India, mindfulness in Japan, volcanoes in New Zealand, religion in Spain and Morocco, and history in Uganda and Rwanda.

# INTERNATIONAL INTERNSHIPS

At Centre, your internship—a guarantee of the Centre Commitment—could take you across the world. Students work closely with their personal career counselors from the Center for Career & Professional Development to apply for these positions.

During CentreTerm and summer 2015, students interned in China, Costa Rica, Croatia, Czech Republic, France, Honduras, Mexico, Myanmar, Nicaragua, Panama, and Peru. From representing the United States while working at the U.S. Embassy in Zagreb, Croatia, to bioarchaeological research in Huanchaco, Peru, the global internship possibilities for Centre students are endless.

The College offers funding for some internships through Internship Plus and the Parents Committee Internship Fund.

# INTERNATIONAL STUDY— ALONGSIDE YOUR PROFESSORS

Each year about 16 of our faculty—from disciplines across the academic spectrum—teach their subjects in the context of another culture. Our chemists have taught art restoration in France and volcanoes in New Zealand; our mathematicians have taught their subjects in Greece and London; our biologists have taught biodiversity in Borneo and marine biology in the Bahamas; our education faculty have taught education in Ghana and Costa Rica; our religion faculty have taught courses in Israel and 'literally' on the pilgrimage route to Compostela in Spain.

Students everywhere routinely say that their study-abroad experience has been the defining part of their college education. At Centre, many faculty say that teaching their disciplines in a different cultural context has broadened and enriched their material.

### STUDY ABROAD FACTS

More than 85 percent of Centre students study abroad at least once.

Options for long-term programs: China, England, France, Japan, Mexico, Northern Ireland, Scotland, and Spain. The tuition cost for these programs is about the same as for studying on the Danville campus.

Options for the three-week CentreTerm change every year. In 2016, they are Argentina, Costa Rica and Panama, Ecuador, Egypt, India, Japan, Morocco and Spain, New Zealand, and Uganda and Rwanda.

Study abroad, an internship or research opportunity, and graduation in four years are guaranteed by the Centre Commitment.
